HIV and Birth Control Women with HIV can safely use any form of birth control to prevent pregnancy.

BARRIER METHODS block sperm from reaching an egg.









CONTRACEPTIVE **SPONGE**

SHORT-ACTING HORMONAL METHODS interfere with ovulation, fertilization, and/or implantation of a fertilized egg.



BIRTH CONTROL PILLS







LONG-ACTING REVERSIBLE **CONTRACEPTIVES** interfere with ovulation, fertilization, and/or implantation of a fertilized egg.



IMPLANTABLE ROD



EMERGENCY CONTRACEPTION can be used after unprotected sex or when another form of birth control fails.



EMERGENCY CONTRACEPTIVE PILLS



Women with HIV can safely use any form of birth control to prevent pregnancy

However, some HIV medications may make hormonal birth control less effective

Condoms are the only method available today that can safely prevent pregnancy and HIV and STIs (chlamydia, gonorrhea, syphilis)







Condoms can be used with other birth control methods
